As I write this I am ending my first month of this new adventure in my career. Let me start by saying I am honored to serve our downtown community. I have had many new experiences and have met many new people in the past few weeks. One thing that is always one of the first questions I get is "What area do you work?". There is a simple and yet fluid answer to that question. My "Beat" extends from 6th Avenue West to 4th Avenue East and then from the #2 Alley (Alley between 1st and 2nd Streets) down into Canal Park where my "beat" ends at the lift bridge.

I have many duties within that area which primarily

you that you are not going to bother us by calling 911 to report incidents. Often times crimes are solved and prevented because an alert citizen calls 911. If you see something that doesn't seem right, it likely isn't right. Please do not feel like you are bothering us. After all, we are here for you!

Also, as this new position of a Downtown Foot Patrol Officer gets going again I'd like to discuss when to call 911 vs when to call or email me. I will always urge you to call 911 to report issues and incidents. One of the primary

reasons for this is documentation. When 911 is called a police call is generated with the date and time the call was made as well as initial information. Documentation is crucial to determining if the issue is part of a larger ongoing issue or not.

Most often, I am not sitting at my desk to take phone calls or email reports of issues. This will cause a delay in issues being reported and in the long run, effect the level of service you as a community is getting from the police department.

If there are times that you would like to let me know of an issue that is ongoing, but not happening at the time, then please email or call me! I'd love to stop by and discuss the issues and look at some creative ways to hopefully solve the issue you are facing.

The entire Police Department and I are here for you, please do not ever hesitate to call us. You deserve the highest level of service from our agency!
